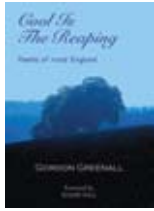
Furniture For All

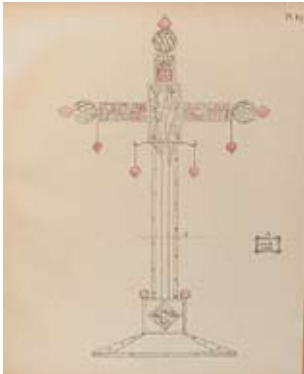


Painting In Action

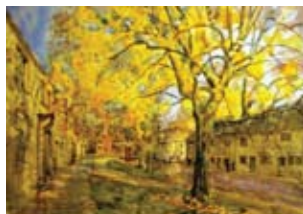
Throw Your Own Pot

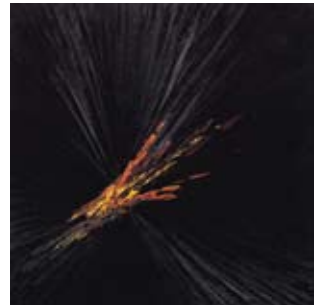
Painting For You
